A report on Code of Conduct Session for I year Students dated on 13/09/2021

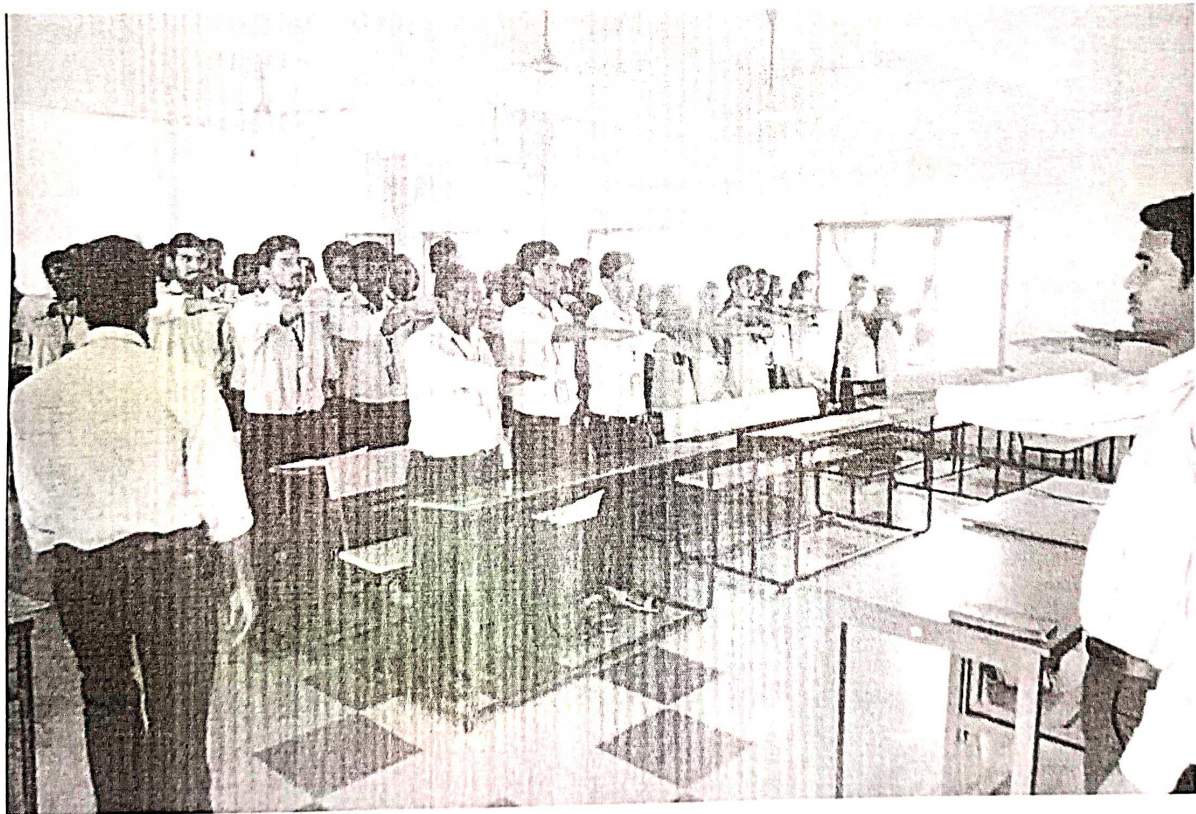
